

he Birla Institute of Management Technology (BIMTECH), Greater Noida organized the 8th AIM-AMA SHETH Foundation Doctoral Consortium and Conference between January, 03rdto 06th 2020, Prof. Jagdish Sheth of Emory University, Prof. V. Kumar of Georgia State University, Mr. Russ Klein of American Marketing Association and Dr. H. Chaturvedi, Director of BIMTECH were the consortium co-organisers. Co-chaired by Prof. A. V. Shukla, Chair, Fellow Program in Management and Prof. Pankaj Priya, Chair, Marketing Area, the theme of the consortium was 'Innovating Customer Experiences in Digital Age'.

Marked by the august presence of more than thirty highly reputed professors and approximately hundred participating doctoral scholars and young faculty from all over the world, these four days of intense academic discourse included an inaugural ceremony, seven workshops, two plenary sessions, eight parallel Global Research Café sessions, ten track sessions on 'Consumer Behavior', 'Technology and Analytics', and 'Strategy', and the launch of the 50th Anniversary Edition of the iconic book Howard-Sheth Theory of Buyer Behavior authored by Prof. Jagdish Sheth. The academic rigor was interspersed with cultural confluences of different performing arts, and musical moments from Indian to Western classics. Four 90 minute workshops held on the 3rd January focused on 'Doing Programmatic Research and Publication Strategies for Making Impactful Contributions' by Prof. A. Parasuraman, 'Qualitative Research Methods' by Prof. Russell Belk, 'Publishing in top-tier Marketing Journals' by Prof. Werner Reinartz, 'Aiming for both Rigour and Relevance' by Prof Rajeev Batra. A 5 hours intensive workshop on 'Conscious Capitalism' was offered by Prof. Ernest Cadotte, Additionally a session on 'Doing Research: Paper and Career Chronicles in the Marketing Discipline' by Prof. Christine Moorman and Prof. Renana Peres was also held. A very useful and relevant session on 'Meet the Journal Editors was conducted, where the participants had deep thinking on publishing by talking to renowned journal editors like Prof. Christine Moorman, Editor-in-Chief, Journal of Marketing, Prof. Kelly Hewett,

Editor in Chief Designate, Journal of International Marketing (JIM), Prof. Werner Reinartz, Editor of International Journal of Research in Marketing (IJRM) and Prof. David Stewart, Former Editor of the Journal of Public Policy and Marketing (JPPM). The editors spoke about the geographical spread of the research papers published in the respective journals, emphasizing on the importance of international collaborations for the authors to have a diverse perspective. The session was interactive, with discussions about the most common reasons for rejection. The participation was overwhelming.

The unveiling ceremony of Dr. Jagdish Sheth's iconic book The Howard - Sheth Theory of Buyer Behavior was chaired by Dr. Harivansh Chaturvedi Director BIMTECH. The book was first published by Wiley USA in 1969. The new 50th Anniversary edition by Wiley Publication India has added relevant new chapters. The concluding ceremony of the Consortium was on 5th January.

The Marketing Conference on 6th January witnessed participation of 50 scholars and academicians from B-schools across India and abroad, to list a few - IIT Madras, IIM Indore, IIM Ahmedabad and Sunway University, Malaysia. The conference was a platform to exchange ideas and good practices of research and to create and strengthen research collaborations. There were 54 submissions through easy chair, which were blind reviewed by faculty from across the country and finally 30 papers were shortlisted for presentations.

A panel discussion on "Innovating Customer Experiences in Digital Age" moderated by Prof. Dhruva Chak with prominent speakers from the industry across different fields had in attendance Mr. Alok Bhardwaj, Managing Director, Creaovate Transformations, Mr. Sajal, Chief Executive Officer, sabziwala.com, Ms. Preet Das, Chief Executive Officer, Digispice Technologies Ltd., Mr. V. Venkata Raman, Vice Chairman, Telangana State Council of Higher Education and Mr. Vishnu Dusad, Managing Director, Nucleus Software Exports Ltd. Alongside the main conference, two sessions need special mention – one on 'Writing a Research Paper for International Publication' where three stalwarts of research ecosystem, namely Prof. Sonjaya Singh Gaur, Distinguished Professor of Marketing at New York University (NYU), Prof. Arunaditya Sahay, Dean Research, BIMTECH and Mr. Vikas Gupta, Managing Director, Wiley India Publications came together and shared their insights on the very topical issue faced by academia. The other was a workshop on the topic "Gamification as a market research tool" by the eminent Professor of Marketing, Prof. Atul Parvatiyar, Texas Business School. The workshop was very insightful and well accepted by all.

Postlunch sessions saw paper presentations in six parellel tracks broadly on three themes - Consumer Behavior, Technology and Analytics and Strategy.



A SPECIAL LECTURE by PROF. VIVEK WADHWA CARNEGIE MELLON UNIVERSITY AND HARVARD LAW SCHOOL, USA ON

THE FUTURE OF EDUCATION



rof. Vivek Wadhwa, Distinguished Fellow and Professor at Carnegie Mellon University's College of Engineering and a Distinguished Fellow at Harvard Law School's Labor and Work life Program, delivered a special lecture on 'The Future of Education' at the India International Center, New Delhi, on 8th January 2020. The opening remarks were given by Mr. Amitabh Kant, CEO, Niti Aayog. The closing remarks were given by Dr. Anil D. Sahasrabudhe, Chairman, AICTE. The vote of thanks was delivered by Mr. Kamal Singh, Executive Director, UNCG India. The event was organized under the patronage of Dr. H. Chaturvedi, Director, BIMTECH, who welcomed all the dignitaries to the event. The sponsors included EPSI, UNCG India and BIMTECH.

Prof. Wadhwa presented a very insightful perspective on how various technologies are evolving exponentially. He stressed that access to such technologies was till now limited to large corporations or governments, but now these were beginning to get democratized and hence available to all. In addition, the convergence of these technologies offered new opportunities across sectors, including education.

He stressed upon the fact that the Indian education tradition was based on the one-to-one system of guru to disciple in the gurukula. The British replaced it with the one-to-many system of standardized education in large classrooms to suit their need of a trained workforce to run their establishments. This system underserves learners as it fails to differentiate between the unique learning context of individual learners on account of parameters such as learning interest, agility, speed and so on. He said technology now allows us to revert to the system of one-to-one education, wherein each learner could have access to individually personalized, AI based robotic tutors that could integrate AR and VR to deliver customized and compelling learning experiences.

His message to the youth of the country was to embrace these technologies and create better outcomes for society through entrepreneurial initiatives. He shared insights from his research that the ability to work with these technologies need not be limited to engineers. He mentioned that only about a third of successful Silicon Valley entrepreneurial ventures are actually started by engineers. There are a larger number of successful ventures that have been started by non-engineers which includes entrepreneurs who have a background in the Liberal Arts, Business, Accounting, Finance and other streams. He went on to say, that youth in India are also endowed with the gift of wisdom based on India's rich Liberal Arts history.

His suggestion for Indian education was to focus on application based Research & Development by leveraging foundational technologies that had already been developed in the West. He gave an example of how India should encourage research on CRISPR CAS-9 based applications as an example. He encouraged scientific research and validation of ancient Indian wisdom and practices such as Ayurveda to come out with more effective health and wellness solutions. In his view India could lead several trillion Dollar initiatives through this approach and become a global contributor. In addition, the unique tradition of Indian ethical values and social commitment enables ventures from India to be more responsible.

The audience of about 100 participants included leaders of several top educational institutions, leaders in social responsibility and the government. Prof. Wadhwa responded enthusiastically to a range of questions that were asked. He also took time out to interact informally with the students of BIMTECH who were really inspired by his words, presence and humility.

Schools are facing the pressure to prove their legitimacy of existence within the ecosystem, and to measure impact on all stakeholders is gaining ground. The common approaches of measuring impact rely on citation of research publications, students' academic performance and alumni's salaries. Such an approach excludes the impacts produced on businesses, government, society, media and the neighbourhood of the B School.

BIMTECH started its impact journey in the year 2018 when it decided to assess the nature and extent of impact on its immediate environment through Business School Impact System (BSIS) offered by European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD). In June 2019, BIMTECH earned the distinction of being the first institute in India to get the BSIS label from EFMD.

BIMTECH has always been focused on adopting quality processes but seldom measured the impact on stakeholders. Through BSIS, it was able to measure its contribution at the local level and test how well it is achieving its objectives for local impact. Following the impact assessment, BIMTECH has started building quality driven impact culture by orienting the strategic intents to measure impact. This is being done through suitable enabling strategies and metrics to capture the economic, environmental and social impacts of the educational, research and other activities.

Visit to Vietnam

BIMTECH is also playing an active role in Impact seminars organized by the EFMD. BIMTECH faculty Dr Chaturvedi, Dr A K dey, Dr Abha Rishi and Dr Nimisha Singh attended the EFMD GN Asia Conference with its theme "Vision 2030: Rising Asia- Impact through the power of collaboration". The two day conference held on November 7 & 8 in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam was followed by the Accreditation and BSIS Seminar.

The two day conference saw discussions on research in the Asian context, transforming through digital age, impact of business school on society, Innovative, Inspire, Influence—Recipes for successful IMPACT.

Dr Chaturvedi, Director BIMTECH was invited as co-panellist along with Dr. Nick Pisalyaput, Deputy Director – Strategy / Innovation / Impact, Sasin School of Management, Chulalongkorn University, Thailand for the session on "Tradition to Education- Change of Culture: Impact of B-school on Society". The session was moderated by Dr. Michel Kalika, BSIS Director, EFMD Global Network. The session debated issues such as how do Business Schools go beyond traditional learning? How to measure the impact of their projects and activities on the society? And what next for business schools when it comesto measuring impact? During the discussion, both the panellists shared their experience and journey for measuring impact

Dr Nimisha Singh, Head- Centre for International Affairs was invited to share experience and journey of BIMTECH for BSIS process. The BSIS seminar "BSIS: Role of Impact and how to Measure Impact" shared the importance of impact, the BSIS process, the different dimensions of impact, difficulties of the process and how it is in synergies with accreditation.

Dr Chaturvedi, Director BIMTECH was invited as team member BSIS expert team who joined Dr Michel Kalika, BSIS Director, EFMD Global Network for impact assessment of SDMIMD, Mysore. During the two day visit, the two member expert team held meetings with different stakeholders of the school and discussed the strengths and shared their recommendations.



9th INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON MANAGEMENT CASES (ICMC-2019)



ICMC 2019



n the 5thDecember, 2019, BIMTECH, Birla Institute of Management Technology, Greater Noida in collaboration with University of Eastern Finland and University of South Florida, inaugurated the two day International Conference of Management Cases (ICMC). This was the ninth year of ICMC at BIMTECH.

ICMC invites stimulating original, unpublished, research / teaching cases, case studies, based on primary and/or secondary data, field studies, empirical data, or significant experience of learning in various facets of management. For the first time, ICMC used a conference management platform Conftool which helped in smooth exchange of communication and organizing tracks, reviews and filing of cases and their revised version.

This year, 74 cases collectively written by 166 authors was presented over a period of two days (5th and 6th Dec, 2019). The conference was attended by 30delegates from 13 foreign countries. Largest contingent of 14 delegates participated from USA. Over all 100 delegates attended the two day conference. First day of the conference witnessed enthusiastic participation from all the delegates representing different parts of the world. Since early morning BIMTECH campus buzzed with energy, intellectual interaction and networking.

The Inaugural Session

The event started with a ceremonial lighting of lamp by Director Dr. Chaturvedi and the keynote speakers. This was followed by greeting the Keynote speakers, Prof. Matthew T. Mullarkey, Director, DBA Program, MUMA College of Business, USF, and Prof. Trevor Williamson, Case Tutor, Case Centre, UK.





The welcome address was given by Dr. H Chaturvedi, Director, BIMTECH. In his speech he extended his gratitude to Prof. Hanna Lehtimaki and Prof. Sunil Mithas because of whom it was possible for BIMTECH to organize the 9th edition of ICMC in collaboration with University of Eastern Finland and University of South Florida respectively. Paying tribute to Late Prof. Sardana, who initiated ICMC, Dr. Chaturvedi emphasized the past success and the future aspirations of ICMC. Conference Co-Chair Prof. Dey's motivating speech set the stage ready for Prof. Matthew Mullarkey's Keynote speech wherein he shared his thought of keeping a business school on the path of relevance for the stakeholders by creating impacts and measuring them. It was followed by the award distribution ceremony. With loud applause and much appreciation 14 awards were announced. Of which ten case writers below the age of 40, were awarded the BIMTECH - Dr. G D Sardana Memorial Young Scholar Award. Apart from that, two SAGE best Case Award was given to the case: "Provoking the Religious Harmony Through Advertisement: A Critical Discourse Study" and "The Case Nishio Glass and Mirror: Looking in the glass to craft meaningful work". The first position of the Case Centre Best Case Awards was bagged by "WoW! Momo -Building a Formidable QSR Chain from a Garage in a Decade".

The Second position went to two cases respectively entitled, "Dynamic Communities: Plotting a New Course", and "The Culture of Commitment"

The first half of the session ended with a high note of energy that was palpable during the Tea Break. The Inaugural session resumed again at 11.45 a.m. by awarding the student winners of the Case Analysis Competition. This was followed by the second keynote speech. Prof. Trevor Williamson, in his speech discussed the review process of a case and made the case authors aware of the pitfalls in case writing that need to be avoided.

The Inaugural Ceremony culminated with the presentation of mementos and the vote of thanks by Prof. Sunil Mithas.

Concurrent Technical Sessions: Seventy four cases were presented and discussed in 18 concurrent technical sessions spread over two days. Each technical session was chaired by two reputed case writers who gave constructive feedback to the presenters' cases.

The stall of The Case Centre was the center of attraction for delegates during tea break. The Case Centre distributed free literature on case writing. The first session of the second day was an important technical session, wherein the 2nd edition of "Forum for collective wisdom" was held.

Highlights of closing ceremony: Gala Dinner was organized, at the end of the first day, at The Stellar Gymkhana, an exclusive Club, promoted by Stellar Parks Pvt. Ltd. for all delegates. It was followed with Ethnic and Western Dance numbers from students of BIMTECH with participation of Delegates. The ceremony ended with Dinner and cocktails.

On the second and the final day, the conference ended with a well-attended Valedictory session. This session was used as an 'Open Space' for delegates to express their opinions.

1st BIMTECH Case Master Workshop

This Year ICMC organized the 1st BIMTECH Case Master Workshop on the 7th of December, which included sessions by Prof. Trevor Williamson on "How to write a theory-based case", Prof. Matthew Mullarkey" Case Research: Divide and Conquer" and Prof. A. K Dey on "Why a case is accepted for publication?"

The full day workshop was attended by 44 participants out of which 23 were external participants and the rest were ICMC delegates and BIMTECH faculty. Inspired by the success of the workshop, ICMC team is encouraged to make it an annual event in which advanced designs, methods of data collection and analysis for case study research would be discussed.

On 7th December a group of seven participants first visited the school under a metro station run by BIMTECH Ranganathan Society for the underprivileged children and then nearby Neemka village which is adopted by us. Neemka trip was organized to provide the foreign delegates a glimpse of Rural India. The event effectively communicated the importance of theatre and drama in one's self-development and enhancing corporate effectiveness. In order to enhance the employability skills in students, the Centre of Business Communications, BIMTECH in collaboration with Fizza Arts, Mumbai, launched the elective-Corporate Effectiveness through Theatre techniques. The first cohort was awarded by Mrs. Lubna Salim.

Followed by the heart-tugging performance of Mrs. Lubna Salim, the next day unreeled before the students the portrayal of an apt Dario Fo's comic-satire "CHUKAYENGE NAHI" performed by Asmita Theatre Group, New Delhi. There are undoubtedly greater living playwrights, but only Dario Fo can create a dramatic situation where the line, "Main toh pehli baar dekh rahi hoon ek police waale ki pregnant laash," sounds perfectly natural. The play is set in a modest working-class flat. It is laced with comedy and it centres on a spontaneous demonstration by housewives against the ever rising prices at the local supermarket. Curiously, it's the women and not the men who show some backbone in the play, and so the play is also remarkable for its feminist views. Fo frequently compares the exploitation of male workers with the unspoken exploitation of women in society in general, at the hands of their husbands. With the subtlety of a comic-satire, it plants within us the seed of different dimensions of the problems surrounding us.

Day 3 of the Drama Festival brought along with it a high voltage stage play, "EK MAMULI AADMI" by Asmita Theatre Group, New Delhi. It is written by Shri Ashok Lal and directed by Shri Arvind Gaur. This Hindi play is inspired by Akira Kurosawa's film Ikiru. The play underlines those features of an urban middle-class setting which make the yearning for real happiness an agonizing experience. The play is a deeply moving description of the travails of a middle-aged clerk who knows of his impending death. It was a heart-winning drama performance and it ended on a high note. At the end of the event Ms. Kakoli Gaur was awarded with the Sarla Devi Birla Award 2019 for her prominent participation in theater industry.

During the entire week, the B-school was home to an overwhelming congregation of many talented intellectuals and artists. The role of theater in the life of a B-school student is often understated and unexplored. But the three-day drama festival organized by Majlis- The debating and theatre society, under the able guidance of Dr. Saloni Sinha gave the students a chance to celebrate the richness and depth of human expression in all its forms. "Excellence with values", the slogan which is at the heart of BIMTECH, was evidently seen getting manifested in the process, and the week long carnival and the foundation day celebrations struck all the right chords and won the hearts of the audience.






SPECIAL ADDRESS ON WATER IS LIFE

He was invited by BIMTECH to interact with faculty and students on 3rd October during the foundation day events.

He enlightened the audience by telling the importance of water and said that "When we started our work, we were only lookiwng at the drinking water crisis and how to solve that, today our aim is higher. This is the century of exploitation, pollution and encroachment. To stop all this, to convert the war on water into peace, that is my life's goal."

Dr. Singh uses a modern version of the ancient Indian technique of rainwater harvesting. TRANSSITION will conduct an innovative multi-disciplinary and multi-institution research to identify relevant technology solutions and business models that can converge to work together for supporting interventions towards development outcomes for minimizing food loss/waste in the food supply chain from farm to fork. This is significant in developing countries such as India, where inadequate cold supply chain infrastructure results in large amount of wastage in fresh produce and inadequate value creation.
