BIMTECH hosts two-day Junior World Entrepreneurship Forum
Biria Institute of Management Technology hosted the Junior World Entrepreneurship Forum on September 2-3, 2011, for the first time in North India. The JWEF is conceptualised and promoted by the World Entrepreneurship Forum—founded under the patronage of Nicolas Sarkozy, the French President, and supported by Jean-Luc Decornoy, KPMG president.
