

BLOOD DONATION CAMP AT BIMTECH

On Saturday, September 21st, the Sustainability Conduit (SUSCo) of BIMTECH organised its annual blood donation camp, promoting solidarity and compassion. The initiative, aimed at addressing the critical shortage of blood in the nation, saw a large turnout of students eager to contribute to this noble cause.
