The company also claims that it has been negotiating with Micromax for about three years now and has finally moved the Delhi High Court to seek legal remedy.

Patent Infringement cases have become common in the western countries where large technology companies such as Apple, Samsung, HTC, Motorola, Google, Microsoft et al are battling multiple cases. However, this is the first time a patent infringement case of such high stakes has rocked the Indian telecom space.

As per Ericsson, the bone of contention is Micromax's refusal to enter into a licensing agreement covering its patented innovations across several wireless technology standards such as GSM, EDGE and 3G.

Section: C Case Study

Give your answers for the following case.

On 22nd December 2013 Ms. Jayanthi Natarajan stepped down as Union Minister for Environment and Forests and she was replaced by Mr. Veerappa Moily. When the previous Environment Minister left the ministry 180 files were lying on the table waiting to get clearance from the minister. Besides, 169 files cleared by the minister were still kept pending without handing over to the concerned promoters. Immediately after taking over the charge, the new Environment Minister cleared the long pending linear projects such as gas pipe line by Indian Oil Company worth more than Rs.1400 crores.

- 1. What are the controversies surrounding the previous Environment Minister led to her resignation?
- 2. What are the set norms for getting environmental clearances?
- 3. What is the procedure for clearing linear projects such as gas pipeline as set by the Cabinet Committee on Investment presided by the Prime Minister in January 2013? Under which circumstance gas pipeline project by Indian Oil Company was kept pending?
- 4. Give your comments on procedures for environmental clearance and its impact on business environment.
